Dr. Nugent's focus includes adolescents dealing with depression, anxiety, addiction, self-esteem, relationship and behavioral issues. He trained in trauma-focused cognitive behavioral therapy, autism spectrum issues, bully prevention, crisis intervention, and Positive Parenting. His professional experience includes Mobile Crisis Team suicide assessment and family support for children with mental health disorders. Currently, he is Supervisor of Behavioral and Mental Health for the Campbell Union School District and the Lead Therapist and Director of the Nugent Family Counseling Center Inc.

Ms. Roveto is a primary therapist for Special Education Classes with the Campbell Union School District. She is a certified trainer in Motivational Interviewing, teaches Mindfulness, and much of her work has dealt with women's issues, depression, and family relationships. Prior to her career in mental health therapy Rebecca was a special education teacher in elementary and middle school.

Receive solutions to some of your difficult problems and learn how to manage some of those frustrating behaviors.
